GENERAL INFORMATION:

The Summer 2019 registration process begins with the publication of this listing for graduate course offerings. Please refer to the “Class Meeting Dates” on the inside front cover for specific term dates.

TYPES OF REGISTRATION:

Online Registration: Graduate students may register online using (S.S. IU) - Self-Service Immaculata University. Please refer to Pages 13-15 for step-by-step instructions on “How to Register Online.”

Online registration will open at **6:00 a.m. on Monday, March 25, 2019**. Additionally, paper registrations will be entered by the office staff beginning on Monday, March 25, 2019. Online registrations are processed in “real time” (24/7) and paper registrations are processed during regular business hours in the order that they are received until the class limit has been reached. Wait lists will be managed through the Graduate Office. All financial obligations must be met prior to online registration and office registration.

ADVISEMENT:

The Graduate Office staff will submit your course selections to your advisor for review, approval and signature regardless of whether you register online or submit a paper registration.

If you would like to meet with your advisor prior to submitting course selections, please call as soon as possible to schedule an appointment.

DROP/ADD - WITHDRAWAL - REFUND POLICY:

Following the submission of either an official add/drop form or a withdrawal form (after the third session), tuition refunds for semester length courses are made on the following basis:

prior to first class.....	100%	after the third but prior to the fourth class.....	40%
after the first but prior to the second class.....	80%	after the fourth but prior to the fifth class.....	20%

If you are a current graduate student at Immaculata University, you can register online for **Summer 2019** courses through S.S. IU (Self-Service IU) beginning at **6:00 a.m. on Monday, March 25, 2019**.

When logging into MyIU for the first time, you must first click the 'Change Password' link on the MyIU login screen. That will step you through changing your initial password to something new. Also, if you have a common last name, there might be a number after your username (i.e. jsmith2). Additional help is available on the MyIU login page or by calling the Graduate Office.

After you have logged into MyIU, click on the S.S.IU channel (no additional login required)

STUDENT FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITY AGREEMENT (SFRA):

All students at Immaculata University are required to agree to the Student Financial Responsibility Agreement (SFRA) once each term before registering for courses. The agreement defines the financial terms and conditions associated with course registration and includes the student's responsibility regarding payment of tuition and fees, IU email, electronic billing, late fees, financial holds, financial aid, course add/drop/withdrawal, change of name/address/phone number and debt collection.

To accept the terms of the agreement:

-From the main menu of SSIU, click Student, Student Financial Responsibility Agreement, and select Term. Read the terms and select the Confirm Agreement button. Once this is completed you will be able to move onto Look Up Classes.

LOOK UP CLASSES:

If you want to view the course listing online, follow directions below. The online course schedule is in "real time" and contains the most up-to-date information with regard to remaining seats.

- Click on **Look-up Classes**.
- In the **Search by Term** box, select a registration term from the drop down menu and click on the **Submit** button. This brings up the **Look up Classes** screen. Please note that if you did not accept the terms of the SFRA above, you will be prompted to do so before going any further.
- Using the arrows to scroll up and down in the **Subject** box, click on the desired subject description.
Note: All graduate courses start with Grad-Subject, (i.e. Grad-Core, Grad-EDL, Grad-Psync).
- Click on **Course Search** at the bottom of the screen to return the results of your search. You may then View Sections as appropriate. Use the back arrow key to move back to prior screen.
- Choose the **Advanced Search** feature to refine or expand your results. (you must select at least one Subject – hold the shift key down to select multiple Subjects.)

Please note, closed sections will be indicated with a "C" in the Select column to the left of the CRN. Please call the Graduate Office if you wish to be placed on a wait list.

Once you are satisfied with your course selections, follow these instructions to register:

ADD CLASSES:

Select a section by clicking on the checkbox to the left side of the search results list. Click the **Register** button at the bottom of the screen.

This opens up the **Add or Drop Classes** page. The class is added to your schedule. You can see it in the **Current Schedule** listing. “**Web Registered**” should appear in the Status column.

Classes that cannot be added successfully will appear under **Registration Add Errors**. The status will denote the error. Click on the **Submit Changes** button at the bottom of the screen to clear the errors.

To select alternate courses or sections click on **Class Search** to return to the **Look Up Classes** screen and repeat the process.

Another way to add courses is to **Return to Menu** after you review the courses on **Look Up Classes**.

- Click on **Add or Drop Classes**.
- Enter the CRN’s in the boxes under **Add Classes Worksheet** on the bottom of screen.
- Click **Submit Changes** and the classes will be added to your schedule or you will see Registration Add Errors.

You will be permitted to add classes online for Summer I and Full until May 19, 2019. For Summer II, you will be permitted to add classes online until July 7, 2019. If you need to add a class after these dates, please submit an add/drop form to the Graduate Office for processing.

DROP CLASSES:

- Click on **Add or Drop Classes**.
- Select “**Web Drop**” from the **Action** pull down list to the left of the class CRN.
- Click **Submit Changes** and the course will be removed from your schedule if the date of the transaction is within the Drop period.

You may drop a class online up until the day before classes begin: Summer I and Full - May 19, 2019 and Summer II - July 7, 2019. If you need to drop a class after these dates, please submit the add/drop form to the Graduate Office for processing. If you are dropping all of your courses for a term, you must contact the Graduate Office as you are not permitted to drop your “**last class**” online. We will assist you.

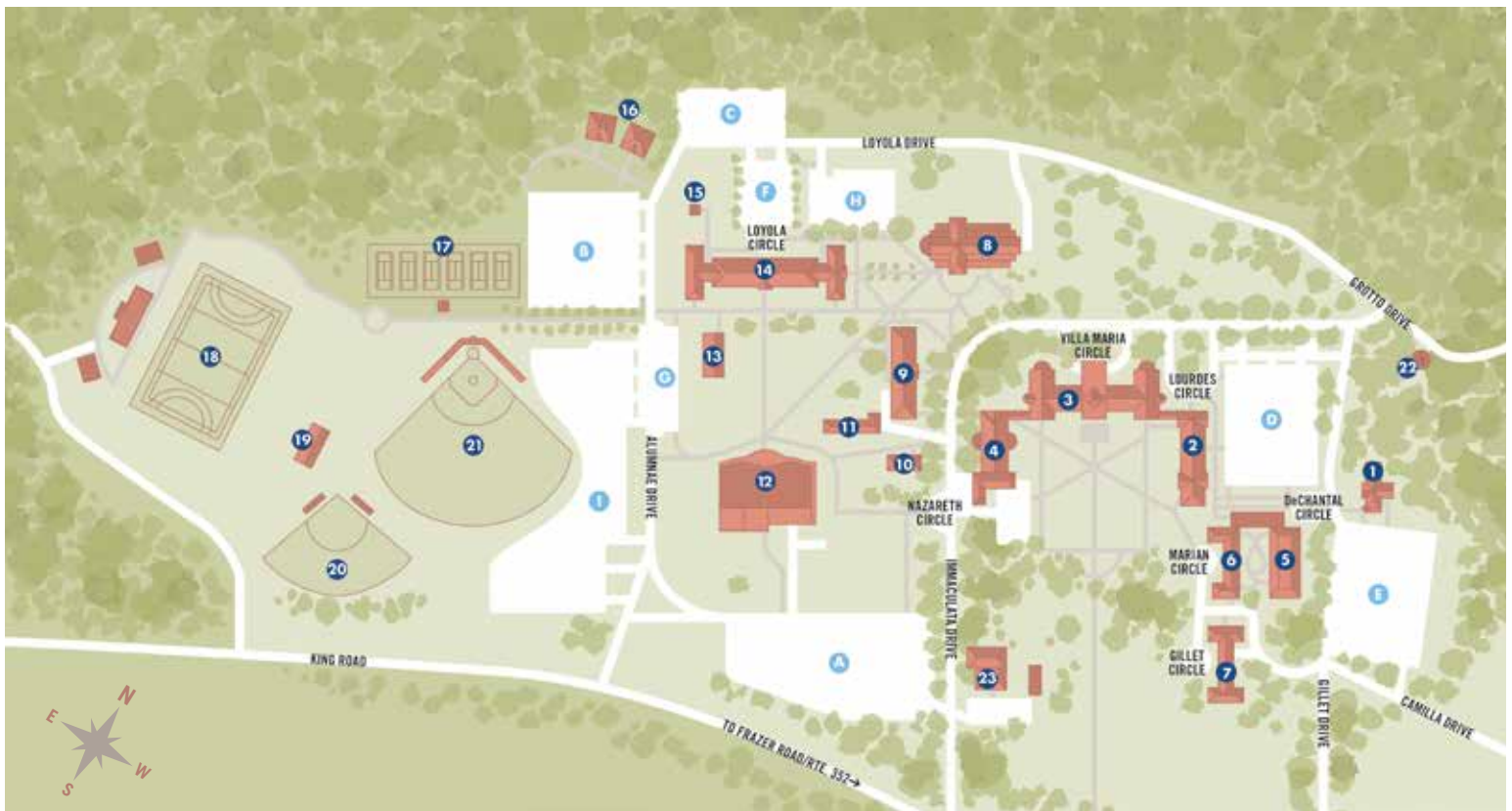

Directions to Immaculata University *(minutes from Exton, West Chester, and Paoli, PA)*

By Car

Rte 30 Lower Merion/Villanova:

Take Rte 30 W/Lancaster Ave towards Paoli/Exton. Continue on Rte 30 W/Lancaster Ave to Rte 352 S/Sproul Rd. Turn left onto Rte 352 S/Sproul Rd. Follow directions from Rte 352 & 30.

Rte 30 Exton/Downingtown:

Take Rte 30 W/Lancaster Ave towards Philadelphia. Continue on Rte 30 E past Rte 202 to Rte 352 S/Sproul Rd. Turn right onto Rte 352 South/Sproul Rd. Follow directions from Rte 352 & 30.

From West Chester Pike (Rte 3):

Travel east or west to Rte 352; follow Rte 352 N. Turn left at light onto King Road. University is one mile on right.

From King of Prussia:

Take Rte 202 S to Rte 29 Malvern exit (follow Immaculata University sign – 2nd exit); bear right to Rte 29; turn right on Rte 29; at 3rd light, turn right onto Rte 30 W. Go to Rte 352 S, turn left. Follow directions from Rte 352 and Rte 30.

From Philadelphia:

Take Schuylkill Expressway (I-76) West to Rte 202 S towards West Chester. Follow the King of Prussia directions.

Turnpike (I-276) West:

Travel to the Downingtown exit 312; take Rte 100 S to Rte 30/Lancaster Ave.; turn left on Rte 30 E/Lancaster Ave. to Rte 352/Sproul Rd; turn right on Rte 352 S/Sproul Rd; follow directions from Rte 352 & Rte 30.

Turnpike (I-276) East:

Follow the PA Turnpike to the Valley Forge Exit (326). Once past the tolls, follow Rte 202 S towards West Chester. Follow the King of Prussia directions.

From Wilmington & I-95:

Travel north on Rte 202 to the Rte 30/Frazer Exit; turn right on Rte 30 E/Lancaster Ave and continue to Rte 352/Sproul Rd; turn right on Rte 352/Sproul Rd; follow directions from Rte 352 & Rte 30.

From Rte 352 & Rte 30:

Travel south on Rte 352. Proceed under the railroad bridge to the first light which is King Road. Turn right onto King Road. Immaculata is one mile on the right.

Immaculata is approximately a 50-minute drive from Philadelphia International Airport, where limousine service is available to the Paoli/Malvern area. The SEPTA R1 train from the airport connects with the R5 train (Paoli Local).
